

HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) recently issued the largest fine ever against a money service business (£23.8 million) for significant money laundering breaches.

There can be no question that HMRC along with the Financial Conduct Authority are targeting payment services firms in order to combat money laundering.

Money laundering prosecutions can often begin with a "dawn raid", with the relevant authorities attending a firm's premises to exercise powers of immediate entry and inspection of company books and records.
