Emerging and Existing Hotspots: Militant Insurgency in Mozambique's Cabo Delgado Region

Mozambique grabbed international headlines in March when an Islamist militant group seized the northwestern city of Palma, a gas hub home to a liquefied natural gas plant owned by French multinational Total. Although the Mozambican army has now reportedly recaptured Palma, the ongoing Islamist insurgency that began in 2017 in the northwestern Cabo Delgado province has not been quashed, and risks of future incidents, humanitarian impact, and business interruptions remain.
