Global

Transparency International's latest corruption report linked some countries' low performance to poor handling of COVID-19.

- The Tokyo Olympics organizers are considering an array of measures to reduce COVID-19 risk, including banning spectators.
- At the Global Economic Forum, Maurice Levy, chair of one of the world's largest advertising giants said that social media companies alone must not be able to decide who has the right to speak. Rules should be the custodian for the future of online safety, and there should be a third party to help eliminate and correct hateful content.

COVID-19 Vaccine

Shortages of needles in Europe are complicating the delivery of COVID-19 vaccinations. Needles have special specifications, both thin enough to minimize waste and long enough to deliver the inoculation.

- US-based Novavax reported that its vaccine had an 89 percent efficacy rate against COVID-19 in a British trial, but only 50 percent against the new South African variant. However, the technology used for Novavax vaccines, provides the means to adapt very quickly to new variants and produce shots at pace to get ahead of the virus.
- Germany's vaccine advisory committee cautioned against using the **AstraZeneca** vaccine with people over 65. Brazilian health regulator Anvisa disagreed, saying clinical trials showed it is safe for elderly patients.

- Data from the Israeli Ministry of Health suggests that both doses of the **Pfizer-BioNTech** vaccine significantly boosts protection against COVID-19: just 317 of 715,425 people still became infected after receiving both vaccine doses.
- Researchers in southern Brazil said they have discovered patients infected with two different strains of the new coronavirus simultaneously, reflecting concerns about the growing number of variants in the country.



Markets

The London Stock Exchange announced it had completed its \$27 billion deal to buy data provider Refinitiv as it bulks up into a major financial data provider to compete with Bloomberg.

- European stocks fell on Friday and the dollar looked set for a weekly gain as a Wall Street battle between hedge funds and retail investors and a row in Europe over COVID-19 vaccine supply cooled risk appetite.
- Asia-Pacific stocks gained on Friday following a rebound on Wall Street as volatility eased.
- US stocks rebounded Thursday as market volatility eased; the S&P 500 and Dow both closed up 1 percent.

- GameStop, AMC and other "meme" stocks dropped Thursday after a number of brokerages, including Robinhood and Schwab, restricted trading.
- The US Senate banking committee is planning a hearing to investigate the stock market's unusual moves, as lawmakers criticized the freeze on retail investors.
- Ratings agencies said that the unprecedented market moves of recent days do not materially impact the creditworthiness of highly traded companies like GameStop and AMC.



Business

GM announced that it will only sell zero-emission vehicles by 2035.

- Apple CEO Tim Cook criticized ad-based social media networks like Facebook for contributing to real-world polarization, loss of trust, and violence.
- Ford will build its Mustang model in China for the first time, hoping to promote its Mustang Mach-E flagship EV to the Chinese market.
- Commerzbank will cut one in three jobs in Germany.
- Visa reported a 4 percent drop in quarterly profits.
- Southwest Airlines lost nearly \$3.1 billion in 2020, and American Airlines lost a record \$8.9 billion.

- Embattled Chinese conglomerate HNA Group said some of its creditors have filed a court petition for its bankruptcy and reorganization after it failed to repay its debts on time.
- WeWork is reportedly in talks to combine with a specialpurpose acquisition company, which could bring the company to public markets.
- Robinhood, the online brokerage at the center of wild trading in equities this week, has raised more than \$1 billion from its existing investors and tapped credit lines from banks to shore up its financial position after a turbulent four days.

Africa

 Amnesty International accused Nigeria of covering up the deaths of more than a dozen protesters during the #EndSARS protests in the fall.

Somalia threatened to leave the regional bloc over ongoing tensions with Kenya.

- In **Zimbabwe**, with borders closed, the rich, who normally leave the country to seek medical care, are being exposed to the dire state of the public health system, long an issue for the poor. Among those who have died in the last few days were two cabinet ministers, a retired general and other high-ranking officials.
- More than 200,000 people have fled fighting in the Central African Republic since violence erupted over a December election result, per UNHCR, with nearly half crossing into the Democratic Republic of Congo.



Asia

 Taiwan's economy last year expanded faster than that of China for the first time in three decades as demand for the island nation's technology exports boosted growth in the fourth quarter.

South Korea said it would begin vaccinations in the general public in Q3.

 In his World Economic Forum speech, Indian Prime Minister Modi promised that more made-in-India COVID-19 vaccines will be sent abroad, further demonstrating India's pursuit of vaccine diplomacy.

The Philippines granted emergency approval to the AstraZeneca vaccine, saying it was
 70 percent effective.

Vietnam reported 82 infections, its first locally transmitted cases in 82 months. The spike in cases comes
as the Vietnamese communist party holds its key party Congress, throwing a wrench in domestic politics.

- Myanmar members of parliament are set to take up their seats on Monday as escalating tension between the civilian government and
 the powerful military stirs fears of a coup in the aftermath of an election the army says was fraudulent.
- Chinese military aircraft simulated missile attacks on a nearby **US** aircraft carrier during an incursion into **Taiwan's** air defense zone three days after Biden's inauguration.



Europe

- Inflation in Germany has risen at the fastest price in five months from December to January, posing a communication challenge for the European Central Bank. Robust exports helped Germany eke out 0.1 percent growth in the final quarter of last year.
- The French and Spanish economies both fared better than expected in the final quarter of last year. The French economy shrank by a record 8.3 percent last year and Spain by 11 percent.
- The UK will formally open a new route to citizenship for up to 3 million Hong
 Kong residents from Sunday; the UK has already allowed 7,000 people from
 the former British colony to settle ahead of the scheme's launch.
- In escalating tensions over vaccine supplies, **Britain** declined to publish details of the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine supply contract because it would "jeopardize national security." AstraZeneca offered eight million more doses of its COVID-19 vaccine to the **EU** to try to defuse a row over supplies, but the bloc said that was too far short of what was originally promised. **German** Chancellor Merkel warned that the country is facing at least 10 weeks of vaccine shortages. **Portuguese and French** authorities have also paused vaccinations in Lisbon and Paris. **Turkey** took delivery of a shipment of 3.5 million doses of the Chinese-made CoronaVac inoculation. It is the second of three shipments totaling 10 million doses. **Hungary and Serbia** began inoculating their Olympic athletes against COVID-19, ignoring the International Olympic Committee's disapproval of athletes "jumping the queue" for vaccines. **French** officials are considering a third national lockdown as new strains drive COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations. According to the Tass news agency, about 20 percent-25 percent of **Russians** have COVID-19 antibodies. **Britain** rolled out new travel restrictions aimed at curbing the spread of several new variants, including the **UAE**, **Burundi and Rwanda**. **German** banned flights from **Britain**, **Portugal and South Africa**.




Middle East

Pakistan's government on Friday appealed to the Supreme Court to review its decision to free an Islamist convicted of kidnapping and beheading US journalist Daniel Pearl, a day after the US expressed "deep concerns" over the ruling.

 Lebanon's central bank governor was charged with dereliction of duty and breach of trust for mismanagement of funds allocated for subsidizing basic goods.

 In the UAE, Dubai will require pre-flight PCR tests from all visitors regardless of country of origin as of January 31.

- **Israel**, which has the most advanced vaccination campaign in the world, by some metrics, extended its vaccine appointments to those 35 and older.
- Morocco began its vaccination drive.
- Pope Francis will meet Iraq's top cleric, Ayatollah Sistani, during travels to the region.



Americas

- Hundreds of journalists and opposition activists protested peacefully in **Haiti's** capital against violence against journalists and police brutality.
- A **Colombian** court accused eight former FARC guerillas of war crimes and crimes against humanity.
- Confirmed cases in Brazil surpassed 9 million. Brazilian authorities sent a team to investigate reports of COVID-19 deaths among children of the Indigenous Yanomami people.
- Mexico's death toll surpassed India's, reaching 155,455, now the world's third highest.
- Authorities in the **Ecuadorian** capital of Quito have closed down a clinic that administered 70,000 fake coronavirus vaccines, charging people \$15 for each dose.
- Russia delivered the first batch of its Sputnik V coronavirus vaccine to Bolivia on Thursday
 along with a larger shipment for neighboring Argentina, as Moscow looks to play a key role in
 the region's vaccine rollout despite delivery delays.



Americas: US

- President Biden signed a number of **executive orders** aimed at expanding access to **healthcare**, including ending the ban on federal funds going to foreign-aid groups that perform abortions and related services. Biden will sign executive orders on **immigration** next week.
- Across the nation, 22 million Americans have received one or more dose of coronavirus vaccine. In an effort to get
 students back in school, a medical center in rural northeast Georgia vaccinated teachers ahead of the State eligibility
 schedule, resulting in Georgia Department of Public Health suspending all shipments of the vaccine to the facility for six
 months.
- Hospital admissions on Thursday fell to their lowest level since early December, although the nation still reported another day of 4,000 deaths. January has been the deadliest month of the pandemic for the US. California reported more than 700 fatalities in a single day for only the second time since the start of the pandemic. An investigation by the NY state Attorney General found that the governor's office undercounted nursing home deaths by as much as 50 percent. South Carolina health officials confirmed the presence of the South African coronavirus variant in the US.
- The rate of the **US economy's rebound** from the coronavirus-fueled downturn slowed in the Q4, weighed down by a deadly surge of cases over the holiday season. **GDP** advanced 4 percent on an annualized basis. **Weekly jobless claims** fell to 847,000.
- President Biden has named Robert Malley as special U.S. envoy for Iran. The White House said that the Biden
 Administration will review Trump Administration policy on Cuba. The White House also said Brazil will be a "key player" in
 climate negotiations with the Biden Administration.



Tax Season 2021: Remote Work, Stimulus Checks, and Local Finances

The fast-approaching 2021 tax season promises to bring a fresh wave of headaches and confusion across the United States. Taxing remote workers is shaping up to be an interstate mess, with financial implications not only for workers themselves but also for municipal budgets across the country. The government's stimulus checks add a new level of complexity to filing returns, as the coming months serve as another opportunity for Americans to get the stimulus balance they are owed.

Overall, the upheaval in the labor market will require millions of Americans to learn fast about taxable unemployment insurance, taxes under self-employment, and how to file gig-work income.

The 2020 trend of telecommuting workers moving across state lines has made it clear that US tax laws are not designed for remote work. As working from home promises to become an enduring trend, the 2021 tax season will be a first test of how interstate tax laws can function - and how states and cities rethink their tax base. Typically,

workers pay tax where their job is physically located. Now, the question of which state remote workers should file in has become a disputed issue that has reached as high as the Supreme Court, where New Hampshire (which does not have an income tax) has sued Massachusetts over Massachusetts' rule requiring telecommuters to pay income taxes on work completed outside of Massachusetts that would have been completed in Massachusetts if not for the pandemic. The case, which the Supreme Court invited the Biden Administration to weigh in on this week, will impact the fate of similar tax laws in New York and five other states. New Jersey and Connecticut, who both have huge tax revenues at stake, have backed New Hampshire's position in the suit. The situation will not be quite so complicated for all remote workers; for example, Maryland, Virginia, and DC and a handful of other states have long had arrangements to allow interstate commuters to file taxes where they live.

The facts of remote work tax requirements are not widely known - according to an October survey from Harris Poll and the American Institute of CPAs, 70 percent of Americans were unaware that remote working from another state impacts tax bills. Some states have reacted to the pandemic with new policies to make taxes easier for

remote workers. Thirteen states and DC agreed in the spring not to enforce tax rules for people working remotely within their borders because of the pandemic. Other states and cities, watching budget deficits grow as incomes relocate elsewhere, are trying to hang onto what income tax they can. Over the past year, big cities like New York and San Francisco have already steadily lost sales tax revenues from relocated workers. Now, state and city governments may be looking at an even more dramatic hit to their finances - particularly as an increasing number of companies are promoting permanent remote work or hybrid models that will only require workers to come into the office on select days.

Beyond the problems of taxing remote work, the 2021 tax season will have to deal with both the continued issues of 2020's stimulus checks and the overall upheaval in the labor market that forced many Americans to seek either unemployment insurance or new forms of income for the first time. The IRS sent out two rounds of stimulus in 2020 (checks for \$1,200 in March and \$600 in December), but for various reasons not all Americans received all the money they were entitled to. For example, some who earned high incomes in 2018 and 2019 but low incomes in 2020 may not have received the checks even

if they qualified under 2020 income levels. Others who simply did not file in 2019, or filed as dependents, may file their own 2020 tax returns to receive retroactive stimulus payments. The stimulus policy errs on the side of overpaying Americans, so those who received more money in the initial distribution of checks than they should have based on 2020 tax returns will not have to pay any money back (for example if their 2020 income level jumped above the standard for stimulus qualification).

However, unemployment insurance payments will remain taxable income, sparking some worry that many people who had not previously relied on unemployment will not realize they owe taxes until they file returns. As an unprecedented number of Americans lost jobs, relied on unemployment, or took up new self-employed or gig positions to earn income, this tax season promises to be thoroughly confusing for a broad cross-section of Americans. For lower-income Americans, tax season often provides a much needed refund check - the average refund in recent years has been over \$2,500. In particular, as the impact of December \$600 stimulus checks is fading quickly, and the prospects for \$1,400 stimulus checks remain uncertain, tax refunds may prove a key source of emergency cash for families in need. The



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IRS pushed the start of tax season back to February 12 following late tax law changes passed at the end of December. In order to ensure that tax refunds are still returned quickly, the IRS is urging Americans to file electronically with direct deposit, assuring that people who do so will receive any refund within three weeks. However, the IRS has also called for taxpayers to "be patient" about challenges the agency will face.

Following a year of upheaval for workers across the country - even those lucky enough to be able to work remote - the 2021 tax season is likely to feel frustrating and confusing for many. In this situation, many workers will look to employers for guidance on navigating the novelties of 2020 taxes, once again adding to the ways the pandemic has heightened corporate responsibility in looking out for employees. Looking beyond 2021, the coming tax season will also provide an example of how interstate regulations may need to accommodate a more mobile national workforce. From where people can register for

COVID-19 vaccines to how insurance providers handle more dispersed clients, 2020 has caused public and private regulatory systems to consider how they will account for new flexibility in where and how people live and work.




