Overview

His strengths include risk and option analysis, development and implementation of strategies, working in collaborative teams with lawyers, experts and other stakeholders on complex or sensitive lawsuits, and counsel work. He is a trusted advisor providing practical counsel and guidance on resolving a broad range of disputes being handled by Dentons' Edmonton office and Dentons' National Litigation and Dispute Resolution practice group.

- Reid v Bitangcol, 2016 ABQB 122: Advised in Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta decision dismissing the
 defendants' application for production of records, based on our clients' continuing litigation privilege, in a
 medical negligence/catastrophic personal injury claim.
- Gulevich v Miller, 2015 ABCA 411: Advised in Alberta Court of Appeal decision that addressed "the difficult issue of situating a tort in order to establish jurisdiction". The appeal court held that the Alberta court has constitutional jurisdiction over our client's professional malpractice / personal injury action in a case when breach of the duty of care occurred in Ontario and the injury manifested in Alberta.
- Chorney v Thompson, 2014 ABQB 410: Advised in successful summary dismissal of an action against our client, a physician.
- Nette v. Stiles, 2012 ABQB 290: Advised in Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta decision dismissing the
 Canadian Chiropractic Protective Association's application to add it as a party to our client's action
 commenced against a chiropractor alleging that the plaintiff suffered catastrophic injuries resulting from his
 treatment, and to set aside judgments obtained against the chiropractor.
- Allison v. Francescutti, 2003 ABQB 983: Successfully defended the applicant, a physician, interpreting Alberta's Limitation Act in a medical malpractice claim.
- Confidential clients: Advising in connection with litigation of personal injury matters including fatality and catastrophic injury. Co-counsel representing an insurer's CA\$25 million subrogated recovery claim for damages in a product liability action.
